More about grading...

Students will be given a daily participation grade (phone) - any absence results in no points, but an unexcused absence results in a zero.

Binder Checks will be conducted at the conclusion of each unit. Students will be required to have notes & other work in their binder that we did during that unit. Any missing notes or work will be deducted from overall grade. If you're absent-get your notes caught up!!

There will be a test at the conclusion of each unit. Students will be given a study guide & formative assessments will be used to fix content mastery as the unit progresses. There will be a cumulative final exam (20% of grade) at end of course.

Any other grades will come from in class assignments (bell ringers, exit slips, handouts, charts, etc).

Make-up & Late Work Policy:

- If you are absent from class & it is excused, you will have 3 days to turn in. (Per ACHS Policy)
- To find out what was missed after an absence, look on the calendar and look in the absent folders found in the front of the classroom. You will find a copy of any handouts you missed that day with your name on it. Complete and turn into Ms. Vasser personally (do not just lay on my desk!)
- Missed tests and quizzes may only be made up before or after school, or during ESS, unless circumstances require
 otherwise.

Daily Expectations

- Be to class on time. If you're not in room when the bells rings, that is a tardy.

- When you enter class, head straight to the chromebook cart and retrieve your assigned chromebook.
- While back there, put phone in your assigned pocket.
 Your daily participation comes from this simple task.
 You will get this back within the last 5 minutes of class.
- Most classes will begin with a Bell Ringer- start on it as soon as the bell rings. Most classes end with an exit slip- take these seriously.
- Take notes when directed. You do not have a textbook so these are your only resource. Do not lose these.
 Remember, you are given points for you notes on your binder check grade!

Behavior Expectations

I expect students to enter class on time and come prepared to learn. While I want you to enjoy yourself during class, that will occur through learning, not through chatting with friends, playing with a cell phone, sleeping, etc. I also expect you to give your classmates the opportunity to learn while in the room. Do not distract your classmates from learning.

If expectations are not met, the following will occur: First Offense: I will give you a verbal warning. Behavior is to be corrected immediately.; Second Offense: I will call home and you will lose participation points; Third Offense: No behavior should reach this point. If it does, a referral may be sent to the office.
